## Our learning this half-term....

#### **Making Friends**

There are lots of opportunities in the day to play and interact. Staff skilfully support the children as they make new friends. During group times we encourage children to talk about their own lives and to get to know each other. By reading stories about families such as 'So Much' the children are able to relate to the family members in the story. They feel comforted by talking about their home lives and want to share who is special to them. Curricular Intention 2: To lay the foundations to become a confident communicator

We spend time in group sessions explicitly teaching children about routines and expectations. We use puppets, role play and stories about tidying to model how to look after our resources and to share and take turns. The children have had the chance to be the 'tidy up inspector' and they have enjoyed spotting and praising children who are looking after toys. We encourage the children to be proud of their setting and know they feel confident when they understand the routine of the day and what is expected of them.

Curricular Intention 1. To be settled at nursery school and become a confident learner Curricular Intention 3: To attend to their own self-care needs and understand healthy living

The children found reading this story very exciting! We encouraged the children to explore what they knew about the story through their play. The children searched the garden for the characters who were hidden and ticked them off on their clipboard. They also created the characters using playdough. During group times the children talked about the sequence of events in the story and an adult scribed this as a story map. Some children painted or drew pictures from the story and adults scribed their ideas. The children listened to and sang The Gruffalo song whilst adding their own actions. They displayed lots of enthusiasm and energy in the role!

Curricular Intention 10: To develop skills and processes for self-expression, creating with a purpose in mind

After learning where the characters in 'The Gruffalo' lived the children then had the opportunity to build homes or 'habitats' for toy woodland creatures in the garden. They used logs, leaves, feathers and other natural resources that they could find. They talked about why the animals might need a safe place to hide and the importance of them being warm and dry as autumn begins.

Curricular Intention 6: To take care of their environment and begin to understand changes Curricular Intention 1. To be settled at nursery school and become a confident learner Curricular Intention 2: To lay the foundations to become a confident communicator

The children are learning about sharing and giving and how we can support others less fortunate by donating food. The children have been practising their harvest songs to perform to their families.

Curricular Intention 7: To understand that they are part of a diverse community within Bedford, England.

Curricular Intention 10: To develop skills and processes for self-expression, creating with a purpose in mind

Over the last two weeks before the half term the children will be learning about the Autumn. They will be spending time looking for signs of Autumn in the garden and finding natural resources such as leaves and conkers. We will use these resources for various activities such as art, counting and

recognising patterns. We will be reading traditional tales about the Autumn harvest such as 'The Little Red Hen' 'The Enormous Turnip' as well as 'Oliver's Vegetables'. We will talk about healthy food and the children will make and taste soup.

Curricular Intention 3: To attend to their own self-care needs and understand healthy living

There is much excitement every week when it is time for our weekly sessions with our music teacher, Jenny, from the Bedford Borough Music Hub. During these group sessions the children sing songs, use percussion instruments and play musical games. These activities develop their understanding of musical elements such as pitch, rhythm and tempo. We have noticed that these sessions are also encouraging the children to listen, pay attention and follow instructions.

# **Safeguarding Procedures**

To ensure the safety of all our children at school we would like to remind you about the importance we place on Safeguarding.

- Please ensure that you close all doors and gates behind you as you arrive and leave nursery.
- Please do not let other adults into the building always ask a member of staff to answer the door.
- If your child needs to use the toilet before their session starts please use the visitors toilet we ask that parents do not enter the children's toilets.
- Always close the main black gate as you arrive and leave the site.
- Alert us if you see someone unfamiliar on the school site.
- Please do not use your mobile phone whilst on the school grounds keep it in your pocket or bag as soon as you
  come through the gates on to the school site.
- Ensure that the appropriate age restrictions and parental controls are in place and that you monitor/supervise online content that your child watches at home.
- If you are not going to be the person collecting your child from school, please let us know in advance we will not allow any child to leave with an adult we do not know. The person collecting your child must be at least 18 years old.
- If you are running late to collect your child for any reason please ring the school office to let us know.
- If you see or hear anything while you are in nursery that concerns you please ask to speak to a Designated Safeguarding Lead, Julie or Suzie.

#### **Mobile Phones**

Please remember to put your phone away when you arrive at nursery, from when you enter the gate and whether inside or out.



### Name cards

When you drop your child off, please support them to find their name card in the room. By matching their name card, children begin to recognise and form the letters from their name.

### School Fund

Please remember to

donate your £1 school fund to the school office. This contribution goes towards providing healthy snack for the children throughout the day. If each family donated just £1 per week we would have over £100 per week to spend on the children. Thank you.

#### Winter Clothes

Crocs are not suitable footwear to wear to Nursery School.


